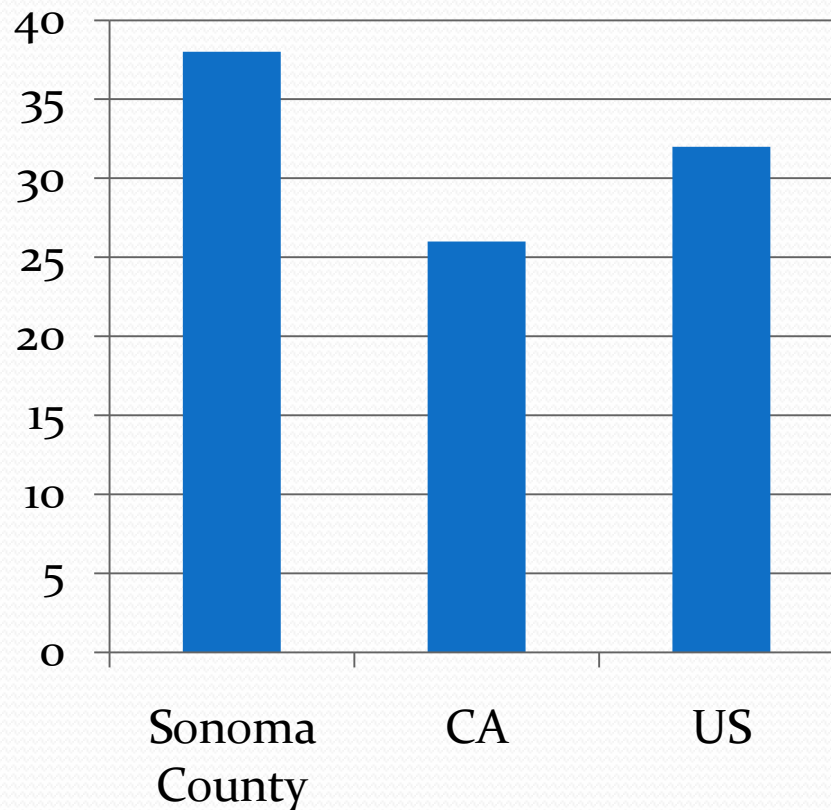
## What is a Nonprofit?

A nonprofit is an organization that serves the community by providing much needed services for people, animals or the environment. *Their Focus is not on making a profit.*



## How Does Sonoma County Measure Up?

The Santa Rosa area has the highest amount of volunteering in California with 38% of its residents volunteering. There are over 800 nonprofits in Sonoma County which provides a variety of volunteer opportunities.

# Next Steps in Researching Opportunities

- Make a list of agencies you are considering
- Include the agency name, contact person, phone number, email and job description
- When contacting, have paper and pencil to take notes
- Call to see if opportunity exists and be open to other opportunities that you can consider
- Ask for specifics: when the job starts, what it entails, and who will supervise you.

# What's Expected of You...

- Be sure to have directions and transportation set up
- Be on time, if not early
- Dress appropriately, whether in the office or outdoors
- Introduce yourself and ask where you sign in
- Ask for your supervisor, and shake their hand
- Ask for instructions, if you do not fully understand, ask questions
- Make a good first impression, it can lead to a job!
- Notice your takeaways, what you're learning can be a skill to put on your resume or college application

They don't expect perfection, they just expect professionalism
